London's iconic 2,256-seat Covent Garden (1858) in the heart of London's theatre district, **Royal Opera Hous**e is home to Britain's oldest national opera and ballet companies: The Royal Opera, currently under artistic direction of Musical Director

Antonio Pappano and Director of Opera Oliver Mears; The Royal Ballet, under the directorship of Kevin O'Hare; and the Orchestra of the Royal Opera House led by Pappano (opera) and Koen Kessels (ballet).

LA SCALA

Via Filodrammatici, 2, 20121 Milano MI

The most famous opera house in the world, Milan's **Teatro alla Scala** (1778) is the birthplace of the artform. The simple exterior reserves the opulence for within. Apart from its sheet beauty and size (2,200 seats), **La Scala**'s acoustics are said to be

perfect. The venue is home to the La Scala Theatre Chorus, Ballet and Orchestra, as well as the La Scala Theatre Academy. **Riccardo Chailly** is the current Music Director and Principal Conductor.



OPÉRA NATIONAL DE PARIS

Palais Garnier, Pl. de l'Opéra, 75009 Paris Opéra Bastille, Pl. de la Bastille, 75012 Paris

Founded more than three centuries ago by Louis XIV, **Opéra National de Paris** holds performances across two theatres, the 1,970-seat Palais Garnier (1875) (*pictured*)

and the 2,700-seat Opéra Bastille (1989). Opéra de Paris' season was compiled under former music director **Gustavo Dudamel**. The Paris Opera Ballet's current director of dance is former Etoile **José Martinez**.

LIMELIGHT PREVIEW

PALACE OPERA & BALLET'S NEW SEASON IS AN ABSOLUTE RIPPER WITH 11 OPERAS AND SEVEN BALLETS COMING THE WAY OF AUSTRALIAN AUDIENCES.

Top of the bill has to be **Barrie Kosky**'s new production of Wagner's *Das Rheingold*. It's the first part in his *Ring Cycle* for the Royal Opera House, and rumour has it that the Australian director's fabled imagination has been working overtime.

The Royal Opera House features in three other screenings, including a new *Carmen* from ever-inventive Italian director **Damiano Michieletto**. Their two revivals look pretty enticing as well, with the magnetic **Asmik Grigorian** headlining *Madama Butterfly* and **Jonas Kaufmann** returning for *Andrea Chénier*.

Italy also offers its fair share of new productions, starting with **Simon Stone**'s take on Boito's *Mefistofele* for Opera di Roma. The Australia director's radicalminded productions are everywhere these days, and it will be fascinating to see what he does with the Faust story. Also from Rome is brilliant film and stage director **Emma Dante**'s new staging of Poulenc's *Dialogues des Carmélites*, and from La Scala, Dvořák's *Rusalka* should be



fascinating, along with a new *Don Carlo* conducted by **Riccardo Chailly** with an outstanding cast including **Francesco Meli, Anna Netrebko** and **Elina Garanča**.


Elsewhere, Opéra de Paris's *Turandot* will be worth catching for **Sondra Radvanovksy**'s ice princess, while Michieletto also steers their new production of Massenet's *Don Quichotte*.

Ballet fans can look forward to a special presentation of **Matthew Bourne**'s vampire-inspired *Sleeping Beauty*, and there's plenty of choice in December with the Royal Ballet's *Don Quixote*, choreographed by **Carlos Acosta**, and Christmas Eve screenings of *The Nutcracker*. Later in the season is a chance to see **Liam Scarlett**'s subtly enhanced *Swan Lake*. In other words, riches galore.




